Note: *Actual* tons of poultry manure shipped and received may be greater than the totals shown here due to Program rules that limit the reporting of gross vehicle weights to 80,000 lbs (unless hauler has an Exceptional Hauling Permit). For example, if the gross vehicle weight of a truckload of manure was greater than 80,000 lbs. (e.g., 81,000 lbs.) then anything over 80,000 lbs. – in this case 1,000 lbs or ½ ton -- will not be eligible for manure transport payment.

SUBMISSION OF WEIGHT TICKETS AND ESTIMATED TRUCK WEIGHTS

A printed or handwritten weight ticket must be provided for each truck load that is weighed at a State-certified scale. At least 1 in every 5 loads must be weighed at a certified scale, with a minimum of 2 loads weighed per manure transport project. Enter the information from each weight ticket onto the *Weight Ticket Log*.

If a State-certified scale was not accessible for a particular truck load, provide an estimated net weight based on an average of previous similar loads. Indicate on the *Weight Ticket Log* that the entry is an estimated weight by selecting "ESTIMATED WEIGHT" from the pull down menu in column (1). Then enter the estimated net weight in pounds in column (6).

Gross vehicle weights are limited to no more than 80,000 lbs, unless the transporter has a valid Exceptional Hauling Permit issued by the Maryland State Highway Administration that allows for vehicle weights up to 87,000 lbs. In order to enter gross weights over 80,000 lbs on the worksheet, check the box at the top of the *Weight Ticket Log*. Every truckload over 80,000 lbs must be weighed on a State-certified scale (no "Estimated Weights" allowed), and the truck license plate number must be written on the weight ticket so that MDA can distinguish between loads transported under Exceptional Hauling Permits and those not under permit. A copy of the Exceptional Hauling Permit(s) must be attached to the claim for payment.

For transport that is ≤ 25 miles, truck loads are not required to be weighed. Tonnage may be estimated based on the dimensions of the cargo area. If estimated tonnage will be determined in this manner, please contact MDA for further instructions.

Stored tare weights are good for a period of one month.

Weight tickets must provide the following information:

- Location of scale
- Date
- Gross vehicle weight
- Tare weight
- Net weight
- Truck ID or license plate number
