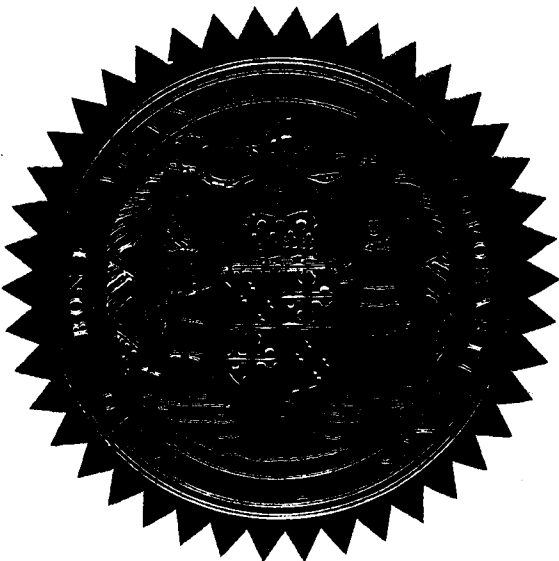
Proclamation

SEPTEMBER 13 - 17, 2010
